

AMATEUR RADIO - WHO IS IT FOR ?

AMATEUR RADIO IS FOR ORDINARY PEOPLE, OF BOTH SEXES, FROM ALL WALKS OF LIFE. MOST MEMBERS OF OUR CLUB, AND INDEED MOST CLUBS, COME FROM NON-ELECTRONICS BACKGROUNDS. THE AMATEUR RADIO SERVICE IN CANADA WAS NEVER INTENDED TO BE THE PRIVATE DOMAIN OF ONLY ELECTRONICS EXPERTS. THE VAST MAJORITY OF LICENSED AMATEURS FIRST BECAME ACQUOINTED WITH RESISTORS, DIODES, TRANSISTORS, AND OTHER ELECTRONICS BASICS WHEN THEY ENROLLED IN AN AMATEUR RADIO CODE AND THEORY CLASS.

THE TEACHING OF BASIC ELECTRONICS IS A PART OF THE MAIN EFFORT, AND STRESS IS PUT ON THOSE ELECTRONICS PRINCIPLES WHICH WILL HELP THE CANDIDATES TO BECOME AMATEUR RADIO OPERATORS. THOSE WHO DESIRE TO GO DEEPER INTO ELECTRONICS ARE WELCOME TO DO SO (HOPEFULLY) AFTER THEY GET THEIR AMATEUR RADIO LICENSE.
