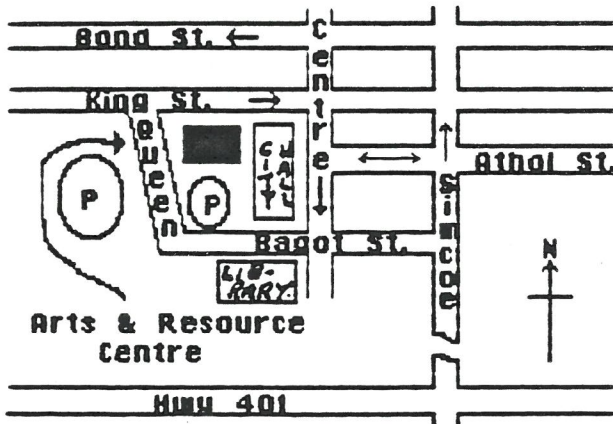

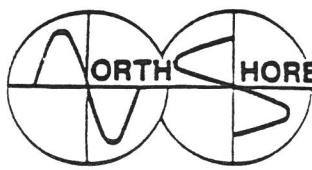

## PROPOSED CHANGES TO LICENSE REQUIREMENTS

THE FOLLOWING IS AN OUTLINE OF THE CHANGES BEING PROPOSED TO THE GENERAL RADIO REGULATIONS PART II (GRRII) AND THE RADIO OPERATOR'S CERTIFICATE REGULATIONS (ROCR) TO PROVIDE FOR THE NEW AMATEUR OPERATOR CERTIFICATES.

THE DEPARTMENT IS PROPOSING A NEW CERTIFICATE STRUCTURE WHICH IS SIMILAR TO THAT USED BY MANY OTHER NATIONS. THE NEW STRUCTURE WILL ENABLE PROSPECTIVE AMATEURS TO:

- A. BECOME CERTIFIED WITHOUT HAVING TO TAKE A MORSE CODE EXAMINATION.
- B. ENJOY EASIER ACCESS TO THE HIGH FREQUENCY BANDS WITH TWO LEVELS MORSE CODE CERTIFICATION.
- C. DEMONSTRATE SUFFICIENT KNOWLEDGE OF TECHNICAL MATTERS FOR THE INSTALLATION OF A MODERN AMATEUR RADIO STATION AND A HIGH LEVEL KNOWLEDGE OF OPERATING PROCEDURES, AND
- D. DEMONSTRATE A HIGHER LEVEL OF TECHNICAL KNOWLEDGE IN ORDER TO BUILD THEIR OWN TRANSMITTING EQUIPMENT AND OPERATE WITHM HIGHER POWER (1000 WATTS)

THE AMATEUR CERTIFICATION STRUCTURE WILL PROVIDE FOR FOUR CERTIFICATES; THE AMATEUR RADIO OPERATOR'S BASIC CERTIFICATE, THE AMATEUR RADIO OPERATOR'S MORSE CODE CERTIFICATE (5 WORDS PER MINUTE), THE AMATEUR RADIO OPERATOR'S MORSE CODE CERTIFICATE (12 WORDS PER MINUTE), AND THE AMATEUR RADIO OPERATOR'S TECHNICAL CERTIFICATE. THESE CERTIFICATES WILL BE REFERRED TO IN THIS DOCUMENT AS 'BASIC', '5 W.P.M.', '12 W.P.M.', AND 'TECHNICAL CERTIFICATE' RESPECTIVELY.

AN OUTLINE OF THE VARIOUS EXAMINATION REQUIREMENTS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- A. THE 'BASIC CERTIFICATE' -KNOWLEDGE OF INTERNATIONAL AND DOMESTIC REGULATIONS; KNOWLEDGE OF PROCEDURES FOR VARIOUS MODES OF OPERATION (VOICE, MORSE CODE, PACKET, REPEATER, SLOW SCAN AND FAST SCAN TELEVISION, SATELLITES, ETC.Z); KNOWLEDGE OF STATION ASSEMBLY INCLUDING BASIC ELECTRICITY, GROUNDING, METERS ANTENNAS, TRANSMISSION LINES, AND PROPAGATION; KNOWLEDGE OF INTERFERENCE DETECTION AND MITIGATION TECHNIQUES INCLUDING FRONT-END OVERLOAD AND AUDIO RECTIFICATION.
- B. THE '5 W.P.M. CERTIFICATE' -ABILITY TO SEND AND RECEIVE AT A SPEED OF 25 CHARACTERS PER MINUTE IN THE INTERNATIONAL MORSE CODE, INCLUDING LETTERS, NUMBERS, BASIC PUNCTUATION, AND Q SIGNALS.
- C. THE '12 W.P.M. CERTIFICATE' -THE ABILITY TO SEND AND RECEIVE AT A SPEED OF 60 CHARACTERS PER MINUTE IN THE INTERNATIONAL MORSE CODE, INCLUDING LETTERS, NUMBERS, BASIC PUNCTUATION, AND Q SIGNALS.
- D. THE 'TECHNICAL CERTIFICATE' -KNOWLEDGE OF ADVANCED ELECTRONIC THEORY COVERING TRANSMITTERS, RECEIVERS, AND AMPLIFIERS; KNOWLEDGE OF CONSTRUCTION PRACTICES; ABILITY TO READ SCHEMATIC DIAGRAMS, AND LOCATE FAULTS.

AN INDIVIDUAL MUST HOLD THE 'BASIC CERTIFICATE' TO BE ELIGIBLE TO OBTAIN AN AMATEUR STATION LICENSE; THE OTHER THREE CERTIFICATES WILL PROVIDE ADDITIONAL PRIVILEGES. THE STRUCTURE IS DESIGNED FOR MAXIMUM FLEXIBILITY BY PERMITTING ANY OR ALL EXAMINATIONS TO BE WRITTEN AT ANY TIME.



PROPOSED CHANGES (CONT'D)

THE PRIVILEGES AND RESTRICTIONS OF THESE CERTIFICATES ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- A. THE 'BASIC CERTIFICATE'-
  - 1. OPERATION ON ALL FREQUENCIES AND EMISSIONS ABOVE 30 MHZ.
  - 2. MAXIMUM PERMISSIBLE TRANSMITTER INPUT POWER OF 250 WATTS DC.
  - 3. TRANSMITTERS MUST BE OF COMMERCIAL DESIGN AND MARKETED AS AMATEUR RADIO EQUIPMENT (ALL OTHER EQUIPMENT IN THE STATION MAY BE HOME-BUILT).
- B. THE '5 W.P.M. CERTIFICATE'-FULL PRIVILEGES IN THE 3.5 TO 4.0 MHZ AMATEUR BAND.
- C. THE '12 W.P.M. CERTIFICATE'- FULL PRIVILEGES IN ALL AMATEUR BANDS BELOW 30 MHZ.
- D. THE 'TECHNICAL CERTIFICATE'-
  - 1. ALL STATION EQUIPMENT MAY BE HOME BUILT
  - 2. MAXIMUM TRANSMITTER INPUT POWER OF 1000 WATTS D.C.

EXISTING AMATEURS WHO HOLD THE AMATEUR RADIO OPERATOR'S CERTIFICATE OR THE AMATEUR RADIO OPERATOR'S ADVANCED CERTIFICATE WILL BE DEEMED, BY REGULATION, TO HOLD THE BASIC, 12 W.P.M., AND THE TECHNICAL CERTIFICATES. THOSE WHO HOLD THE AMATEUR DIGITAL RADIO OPERATOR'S CERTIFICATE WILL BE DEEMED, ALSO BY REGULATION, TO HOLD THE BASIC AND TECHNICAL CERTIFICATES.

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EXPERIENCING INTERFERENCE

# THOMAS A. EDISON

Edison had only 3 months of formal schooling, yet he became an outstanding scientist and inventor with over 1000 patents in his name. His best known inventions were the carbon filament incandescent electric lamp and the phonograph. After Bell's invention of the telephone, Edison produced a carbon transmitter which greatly improved the telephone's audibility and became the basis for the microphone for radio telephony and broadcasting.

Edison's first patented invention, when he was 21, was the Electrical Vote Recorder. He demonstrated it in Washington, but the politicians turned it down; they felt it would cut down their ability to manoeuvre and filibuster. From then on Edison turned his inventive genius to developing things that he believed had practical commercial possibilities. When Western Union's first crude stock ticker broke down, he developed the Edison Universal Stock Printer, which brought the impecunious 22-year-old a sudden fortune of \$40,000. With this money he set up a manufacturing plant turning out these machines and high speed telegraph printers.

In 1876 he moved to Menlo Park, NJ, and set up the world's first industrial research laboratory, which he equipped as an "invention factory". He promised to produce a minor invention every 10 days, and a "big trick" every six months.

As a boy Al - as Edison was known to friends - had been inspired by Thomas Paine's "Age of Reason" and his declaration that "The world is my country: to do good my religion". Later his imagination was fired by Michael Faraday, a self-taught genius like himself, and he emulated the British scientist by also keeping



detailed notebooks of all his researches.

Over many years Edison searched for a non-acid storage battery that would be an improvement over Lord Kelvin's lead and acid type. His eventual solution was the nickel-alkaline battery.

In 1887 Edison was experimenting with moving pictures. The Eastman Kodak Co. came up with the first continuous-film negative, and this gave Edison his solution: the Edison Kinetoscope made it possible to project moving pictures onto a screen -and the movies were born.

In 1875 Edison discovered "etheric force" when he observed sparks arcing between two points. He did not understand at the time that this was "wireless transmission". But it launched him on research into wireless telegraphy from moving trains - the signals passing from metal plates on the car roof to telegraph wires above. Later he transmitted signals between kites 2-1/2 miles apart. He sold his one and only patent on long distance wireless telegraphy to his friend Marconi.

### Boyhood & Early Days:

'Al' Edison had only 3 months of formal schooling, when he was expelled from school as 'retarded'. For 3 years his mother

taught him, instilling in him a love of learning. He had vast curiosity and a keen thirst for experiment. He taught himself Morse code and became a railroad telegrapher at 16 first in Stratford, Ontario. He was unruly and was fired often, going from place to place as a 'tramp telegrapher'; but he read all the scientific books and journals he could lay his hands on.

In 1868 he landed a job with Western Union in Boston, where despite his unkempt appearance he proved himself a crack operator and a skilled repairer and improver of faulty equipment. He devised many tricks to help his morse speed, like writing so small that a magnifier was needed to read it.

Many fulsome tributes have been paid to Edison. Arthur Palmer wrote: "He has led no armies into battle - he has conquered no countries - he has enslaved no peoples - yet he wields a power the magnitude of which no warrior ever dreamed...This democratic, kindly modest being has bestowed upon the human race blessings instead of bondage, service instead of serfdom, construction instead of conquest...He is humanity's friend."

A recent biographer, Robert Conot, after extensive research for his book "Edison: A Streak of Luck" paints a rather different picture: "The Edison I discovered was a lusty, crusty, hard driving and occasionally ruthless midwesterner, whose Bunyanesque ambition for wealth was repeatedly subverted by his passion for invention. He was complex and contradictory, an ingenious electrician, chemist and promoter, but a bumbling engineer and businessman.
