CAN YOU TOP THIS?

The following was researched and written by Mary Drummend (VE3IYY), a former member of the P.A.R.C. (nnw a silent key) and was printed in their bulletin of August 1984.

Have you ever wondered why amateir radio operators are called 'HAMS'?

The word "HAll" was applied in 1908 and was used as the call letters of one of the first amateur wireless stations. which was operated by some members of the Harvard Radis Cluh. Their names were Elbert S. Hyman, Bob Almy and Peggy Murray.

At first they called their station 'Hyman-Almy-Mrrray". Tyoina out such a long name in code sonn called for a revisina and thoy shortened it to 'Hy-Al-Mu' using the first two letters of each name.

Early in 1989. some confusion resulted hetween amatour wiroless HYALMU and a mexican ship named HYALMO, so they decided to use only the first letter of each name. Thus the call became 'HAM'.

In the early pioneer, unregulated days of radio. amaterir operators picked their own frequency and call letters. Then, as now. some amateurs had better signals than some commercial stations. The resulting interferences finally came to the attention of congressional comittees in Washington. They gave much time to proposed legislation tn critically limit amateur activity.

In 1911. Elbert Hyman chose the controversial Nireless Regulation Bill as the topic for his thesis at Hervard. His instructor insistod that a copy he sent to Senator David I. Walsh. a member of one of the committees hearing the bill. The senator was so impressed that he sent for Hyman to appear before the conmittee. He was pist on the stand and described how the little amateur station was built and he almnst cried as he told the crowded committee room that, if the bill was passed. they would have to close up the station because they could not afford the license fees and all the other requirements which were set up in the bill.

The debate started and the little station 'HAM' became a symbol of all the little amateur stations in the country who were crying nut to be saved from the big commercial stations who didn't want them around. Finally, the bill got to the floor of Congress and every speaker talked aboit the poor little station "HAM'.

The whole story is contained in the Congressional Record of the USA. Nation-wide publicity associated 'HAM' with amateurs and from that day to this (and hopefully to the end of time), an amaterr is a 'HAM'.

HAVE YOU EVER HEARD OF 'FLEA MARKETS'
I am sure you are all aware of them and that they don't sell fleas. I am also sure that you are aware of the joint ventire between the S.P.A.R.C. and the N.S.A.R.C. 'THE DJPHAM REGION AMATEUR RADIU FLEA MARKET' which occurs every April.

Dear Ed.
It suddenly occurred to me that perhaps a little exposure in the club newsletter of my continuous problem with QRN that I am experiencing at my QTH would not do any harm and maybe someone in the same general area as myself could shed a little light on the source.

I have been plagued for over a year now by "noise" on all the H.F. bands ( 80 - 10 ), and the lower the band, the higher the level of noise.
This "noise" is evident all across the band, is there at any time of the day or night, and does not seem to vary with weather conditions.

With the very much appreciated help of Eric HMG. (who is a whiz at locating noise sources), I have been able to enlist the help af John Sanderson and relay the locations of at least three possible sources.

John Sanderson is the Engineer at the Whitby Hydro-Electric office, who not only enthusiastically followed up on this information, he also has called the D.O.C and has had the inspector in this area on a number of occasions.
I must say,it was quite interesting to go out with the inspector, who incidentally is a ham, in his fully equipped vehicle, and with credit to Eric, located the same problem areas.

Now you may think that that is the end of the problem, not so because in spite of the time and considerable money spent by Whitby Hydro, the noise still persists.

I am drawing a rough location of my QTH, and marking with an $X$ the spots that have been checked and overhauled by Whitby-Hydro.

If any one has the time and can go portable with H.F. in this area to check it out, I will be grateful or if there is some one who is experiencing the same problem, perhaps they would call me and let me know.

Well Ed. thats it, I hope it gets published.


If anyone reading this has a ball-point pen with a digital watch and calendar huilt into it and the display has dimmed and/or finally disappearod. then had trouble finding hatteries for it, despair not; all is not lost! Jack (VE3SJ) knows what to look for.

Jack points out that the hattery used is an Enercell 23-14ヶA mercury battery conmonly used in hearing aids and can be picked up at 'Radio Shack': stock n'mher 23-146-590315812. They come in a'sixpack' for $\$ 4.99$ and 'Isually last about 1 year ea.

Jack, himself, prefers to use a Duracell RM414 which can also be purchased in a 'six-pack' at Guardian Drugs (stock number 412-015-205R-J5) for a price of $\$ 6.14$. These batteries are the sane dianeter but thicker and last over twice as long.

Jack repnrts that these watches keep excellent time, have a BIG cartridge and write well so he suggests that if you have one not to hesitate to repiace the battery. (I have one of them in this condition but I think it would be cheaper to buy a new pen inless I $c a n$ find 5 more to use up the extra hatteries--I'm sure to lnse the pen before tivo more years is up. ed.)
