paKet pieCes

Connection Directory - with paKet software you can set up a file containing the callsigns of the stations that you connect to on a regular basis. When you are at the main paKet communicaiton screen, hit ALT + C to bring up the station file. The first column is for a description of the station you wish to connect to and the second column is for the callsign. We will use VE3USH as an example. In the first column type OSHAWA or NSARC or any description that will make it easily recognized by you. Hit the TAB key to move to the callsign info and input

VE3USH. You may want to add other digi's that you regularly connect to as well on the following lines. To use this function when you are not connected to a digi simply hit ALT + C and the same callign file box will pop up. Using your arrow keys select the digi you wish to connect to and hit ENTER. paKet will then connect you to that digi. This will save you some keystrokes, especially if you put your main digi as the first item in the file.

DXpedition!

John Harden, VE3VGI, Winston Seeney, VE3WFS, and myself, Laird Solomon, VE3LKS, and are planning a Dxpedition this summer to Belcher Island in Hudson Bay. We are planning on being up there from June 30 to July 4. This will mean that we will be active during the Canada Day Contest and hopefully add mutlipliers to contestants scores since we will be a VE8 designation. As well, Belcher Island is an IOTA (Island On The Air) island that has been activated only once so we are hoping to produce lots of traffic with stations looking for this contact. We are not sure at this point if we will be able to take any more operators with us since we only have one plane booked for sure. There is a possibility that we may be able to get a second plane but do not want to commit ourselves until it is confirmed. If you would like to participate should the second plane come available contact John, Winston, or myself and we will put your name down as a prospective DXpeditioner. The trip will run around \$600 + food and we will be sleeping and operating from tents. The town of Sanikiluag has a population of about 500 people and apparantly the Arctic Char fishing is fantastic. The only "restaurant" is a lunch bar located in the Co-op store so we will be taking freeze dried meals along to cook on the propane stove. At \$175 per night we will not be using the hotel. Instead, we will be bringing tents to sleep and operate in. The manager of the airport has given us permission to tap into the electicity at the airport so we will not have to take a generator. Logic Bomb....continued from February VIRUS DETECTION The six steps to follow if an

MS-DOS computer user believes a virus has somehow entered the system:

- Back up all hard disk drives immediately.
- * Check the size of all .COM and .EXE files. Infected files will be larger. All .COM files, except for COMMAND.COM, will grow by 1,168 ot 1,280 bytes if infected .EXE files that have been infected can be detected just as easily because they will have grown by approximately 1,514 bytes.
- * Use MS-DOS DEBUG to scan .COM files. Infected .COM files increased by 1,168 bytes will contain the hexadecimal string EBOOB4O ECD21B4. Those increased by 1,280 bytes will contain the hexadecimal string 00568 DB43005CD21.
- * Put all suspicious files on an isolated computer system and reset the date on the internal clock to a date 30 to 60 dayslater. If a virus has somehow infected the system, it will be activated and a notice of some sort should appear on the computer screen, followed by a notice about data being destroyed.
- * Use antivirus software tools.
- * Before restoring files to a suspect computer diskette, do a low-level format.

VIRUS FOILING A computer virus in your system has no chance for survival with the following four steps in place:

- * Use software from reputable sources. Many virus programs are spread by using software transmitted on electronic bulletin boards. or by swapping floppy disks with other users.
- * Make frequent copies of data files the most frequent virus targets. Experts usually can help virus victims restore data from a backup disk or tape.
- * Check for infections with a virus-scanning program, which looks for unusual increases in program size and signs of known viruses. Some also eradicate viruses.
- * Some viruses are programmed to start on a specific date, such as Halloween. To check for viruses that are time- triggered, place a copy of all software on an isolated computer. Advance the system's clock until after a suspected trigger date to see if any virus is activated.


