Solar Cycle 25



Hopefully it will be somewhere in between and the numbers will improve and bring back the propagation. This is a presentation to the Front Range 6 Meter Group by Dr. Scott McIntosh, Nov 11, 2020 on this upcoming Solar Cycle 25. It's a fascinating look at how using 22-year Hale Cycles and their Terminators, we can better predict an upcoming solar cycle intensity like cycle 25 which could be in the top 5 since records began.
