Warren VA3WEB, our POTA expert, got busy on the radio and racked up quite a few contacts. Considering the abysmal band conditions that weekend we were able to get around 470 contacts. I would credit almost all of these contacts to those out there that chase POTA parks. We did spot on sites, like DX Summit, but whenever we spotted ourselves on the POTA site the radios would go crazy. Before the event our QRZ page was sitting at around 1600 hits and, as I type, we are at 2350. People are checking us out, seeing what the North Shore ARC is all about, and it is all because of this group of volunteers who made this a very successful event. 


