To use the special call sign, substitute the prefix normally assigned to your province or territory by the special prefix shown in the following table. For example, VE3 becomes VX3, VA7 becomes VG7, and YV2 becomes XK2, and so on.

HOME BREW "SHORTY 40" INDOOR DIPOLE

VA3NH keeps a modest antenna farm inside his garage. The building is big enough to accommodate four cars -- so it's wide enough for a half wave dipole for 14 MHz that measures 33'5" end to end.

The 40 meter band is a bigger challenge. Literally. A half wave dipole for 7 MHz is nearly 67 feet long: too long to fit inside any residential garage.

W5VM has an ingenious solution for hams who can't have a vertical antenna but lack enough space for a half wave dipole for 40m. His "Shorty 40" is a shortened dipole with one loading coil in the middle. Its total length is only 37' 6".

To make the inductor coil, wind thirty turns of 10 AWG solid copper enameled wire ("magnet wire") around a 6 inch scrap of PVC pipe that is 2 1/2 inches in diameter. "Weed Eater" line of .065 guage is then wound between the wire turns to maintain spacing.

The arms of the dipole, each 18 feet 6 inches long, fasten to the ends of the inductor coil with a couple small bolts that make the connection and hold everything in place.

The lead from the transceiver is 50 ohm RG8X. The coax shield connects to the middle turn of wire in the inductor. The centre wire of the coax connects 2 or 3 turns away from the shield connection, depending on what gives lowest SWR for the segment of the band you prefer to work.

For convenience, two or three copper wire taps can be soldered to the inductor coil (see illustration). Allegator clips on the coax shield and centre wire complete the connection.

A loaded dipole has narrow tuning characteristics, and it is much less efficient than a longer, naturally resonant antenna. Depending on what frequency you are using, SWR will vary from bad to terrible, so a tuner is required. The automatic tuner of my 30 year old transceiver flattens SWR to nearly 1.1 throughout the 40m band.

A Canadian winter will be very unkind to this type of open coil antenna, but the Shorty 40 is an acceptable compromise for indoor installation. Mine has snagged North American and transatlantic DX on several digital modes, with the rig never running more than 50 watts.

Station of the Month

May Shack of the month is from Neil VA3NH









Neil, VA3NH, keeps his station organized in a roll-top desk. Using his 30 year old Kenwood TS850S and a SignaLink sound card, his main interests are brushing up on CW, and experimenting with lesser used analog and digital modes such as JS8, Olivia, BPSK31, SSTV and Hellschreiber.

While there might theoretically be lots of room for outdoor antennas, an HOA

covenant prohibits towers and such. So, Neil has gone stealthy. A Cushcraft dual band vertical, mounted on a broomstick on a workbench in the garage, works fine for regional VHF and UHF. A half-wave fan dipole (or "cat whiskers") for 15 and 20 meters is also located in the garage. This compromise antenna is immune to the weather, and it gets surprisingly decent results with the old Kenwood jogging along barefoot at 50 watts or less.

Special Event Stations

The IARU HF Championships are on the weekend of July 10, 2022, this is where Radio Amateur Teams from around the world attend and compete for the Championship and this year it is in Italy. To celebrate this competition 150 Italian Ham radio operators are operating special event stations from January to July 10, 2022. All you need is 50 points to get a certificate, which is between 10 to 20 contacts depending on which mode is used. They are operating SSB, CW RTTY, and FT8 on all bands from 10m to 160m.
