#### From the President

Last year on Saturday June 17<sup>th</sup> the following people; Thomas VE3PDK, Grant VE3KJI, Daren VE3NMD, Brian VE3IK and myself went on a training session to learn about Amateur Radio Direction Finding which is also called Fox Hunting at the Long-Sault Conservation Area with Roger Egan VE3EGY and Rob Haddow VE3RXH who came from Ottawa for this training. Roger was the person who hosted a presentation on "Fox Hunting... ARDF — Having Fun with Amateur Radio in the Woods" for our club at our April 12<sup>th</sup>, 2023 member meeting. The day was spent learning what equipment is required and how to host a Fox Hunt Event. The goal was to learn how we can setup a Fox Hunt for our club members. They even hid three transmitters and gave us instruction on how to use their equipment for find the hidden transmitters. We split up into a few groups of two people and went off into the Long-Sault trails to try and find the hidden transmitters. Long story made short is most of us did find the hidden transmitters. It was not as easy as I thought. We worked up a sweat as we did a lot of walking. Eveyone had a great time looking for these transmitters. We were told by Rob who hid the transmitters that he went easy on us as the transmitters were just off the trail.

We ended the day with a BBQ at Brian's VE3IK QTH. We discussed the day over a few cold one's while eating some steaks that Brian BBQ'd. Over-all it was a great day. I mentioned that would be great if we could do this as a club event. The only thing we would need to do is get some Fox Hunt equipment.

Well if you remember last year, I had a session on "What does this club want to do in 2023". Well Brian VE3IK signed up for one of his tasks on getting the club some Fox Hunt equipment.

Brian provided me details and pricing of the equipment that the club should purchase. After approving the purchase, Brian purchased the equipment and even offered to allow us to use his

US shipping address that he has to save some money on shipping of the equipment. Well all of the equipment has arrived. Thanks Brian for completing this task.

What was purchased was 4 – Antenna Attenuators, in kit form for basic fox hunting, 2 fox transmitters with rechargeable batteries, 2 more advanced Sniffer receivers and 1 – Fox transmitter Controller for a higher power fox transmitter. Brian has also committed to build the higher power fox transmitter in a metal Ammo box.

Recently Brian VE3IK and Laird VE3LKS organized a building session at Stan's VE3ILU's QTH to build the 4 antenna attenuator kits. Well Brian VE3IK, Grant VA3KJI, Joe VE3VGJ and Doug VE3GVW went to Stan's QTH on Saturday February 10<sup>th</sup> and built and even tested all four kits. Laird and Stan supervised the build from what I heard. A big thanks to all involved in this build.

The only thing that we did not purchase was any 2m hand-held Yagi antennas that are used in fox hunting. I felt that the members can make these themselves. I made a 2M 3 element wood Yagi for fox hunting and showed it up at WFF in the summer last year. I also made a technical drawing on how to build this antenna. This drawing was emailed out to a number of club members. John VE3KZT was one of the members that I sent the drawing to.

John was going to purchase the required metal rod used for the antenna elements and offered to pick up the required rod for some other members. John purchased the metal rod and provided the required rod to the members who placed their order. This is great. I love seeing members helping out other members. Now we just need to build these antennas.

Well last week I sent out an email to those members who ordered and received the metal rod to see if they had built their antenna. I received a few responses back and most informed me that they have not built their antenna as of yet. Some had purchased commercial hand-held antennas and others had antennas that were purchased many years ago.

What that now tells me we now need to have an antenna build session. If you are interested in building a hand-held 3 element wood yagi antenna for fox hunting send me an email stating that you are interested. For those attending the February members meeting, I will be asking for any people interested in building an antenna.

The next step will be to get a few people together to learn how our fox hunt equipment works so that we can train others how to Fox Hunt. My goal here is after a few of us learn, one of us can then do a presentation at one of our upcoming member meetings on Fox Hunting. After that I will schedule one or more brief field sessions to put our combined knowledge together to have a Fox Hunt.

Then when that is complete, we will schedule a club Fox Hunt event this summer for all to attend. We might even make into a BBQ event after the hunt.

If you are interested in a club Fox Hunt send me an email stating that you are interested. I would like to know how many people are interested.

Well I think that's all for now.
